
23 County highlights

- 1. It's famous for its cheese, much beloved by Wallace and Gromit. (11)
- 2. It's a port on the Dinosaur Coast which had its own group of artists in the 19th century, called the Northern Impressionists. (8)
- 3. It is the crocodile-shaped one of the three peaks and its name means Hill of Winds. (3,1,5)
- 4. This valley is best visited in spring when its wild daffodils come out. (8)
- 5. This valley nestles between the moors, below Blakey Ridge. (8)
- 6. This famous beauty spot in the Dales is like a rocky bowl with cliffs and a limestone pavement around the top. (6,4)
- 7. This place stands at the top end of a river valley and has a viaduct named after it on the Settle Carlisle line. (10)
- 8. It's the partly washed away coastal headland, which juts into the Humber Estuary. (5,5)
- 9. It's a well-known promontory in the North Sea, between Bridlington and Scarborough. (5,5)
